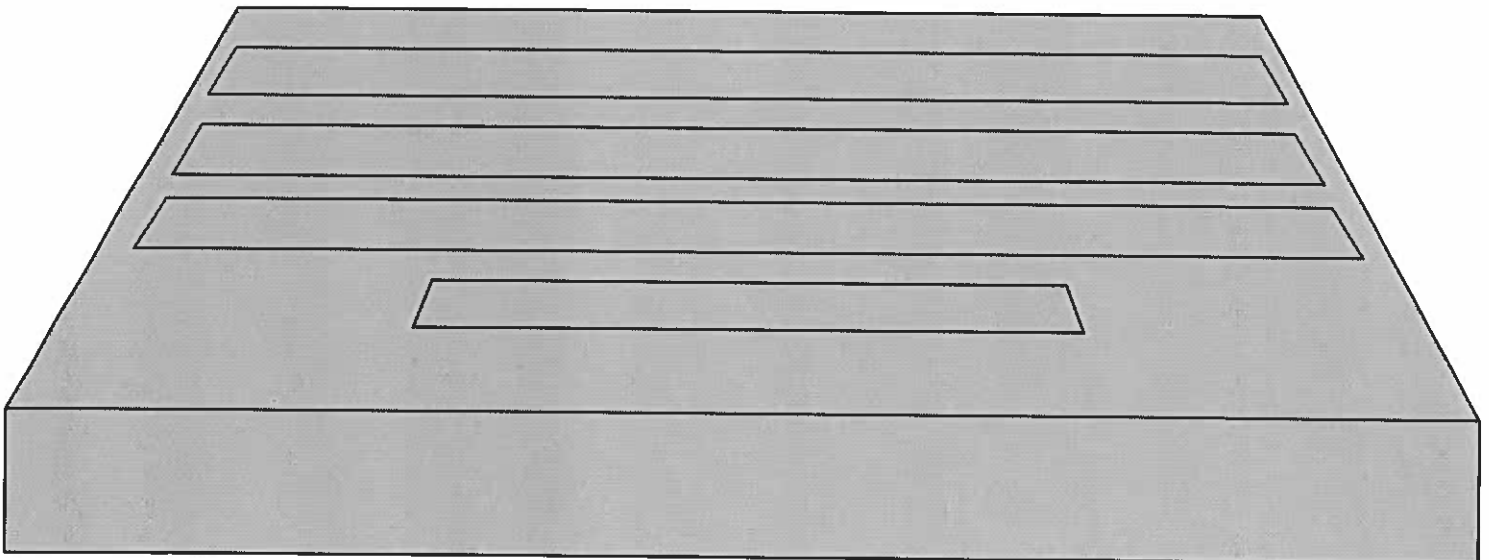

APPLIED DEGREES

Many Ontario colleges offer Bachelor Degrees in Applied Studies. *These degrees require 6 grade 12 U/M courses for admission.* The degree is a recognized degree but as it is granted by a college, it may not be acceptable for university graduate programs (e.g. teaching, law, MBA etc). If you are considering post-graduate work at any time in the future, you should ensure that your post-graduate institute of choice recognizes the Applied Degrees from your college.

Each institution defines its own procedure for applying to the programs (e.g. on the college application, the university application, either one or both. Applied degrees balance theoretical and practical learning strategies and skills.

COLLABORATIVE DEGREES

Collaborative Degrees are delivered in partnership between a college and a university. In most programs, the studies take place at the college *and* the partnering university. Collaborative Degrees are granted by the university and thus, are acceptable for university graduate programs (e.g. teaching, law, MBA etc). For some programs, graduates are awarded both a diploma and a degree.

Each institution defines its own procedure for applying to the programs (e.g. on the college application, the university application, either one or both). Additionally, *each program has its own admission requirements with the minimum being 6 grade 12 U/M courses*. Please check individual calendars for details.

Collaborative Degrees are a well balanced combination of earning job skills usually taught in college and theory that is usually taught in university.

COLLEGE UNIVERSITY TRANSFER DEGREES - ARTICULATED DEGREES -

Articulated Agreements are arranged with universities to assist qualified college graduates to then complete a university degree in a shorter period of time. In other words, you will receive credit for some of your college courses when continuing to complete a university degree. You will graduate with a college diploma and a university degree.

If you are interested in this type of degree, make certain that the college program has a university transfer agreement in place. Check www.ontransfer.ca and/or individual college calendars for a listing of their programs and agreements. We advise you to do this **before** you apply to college so you are guaranteed that the transfer will be available upon completion of your diploma.

Admission requirements are based on college standards. Thus, *the 6 grade 12 U/M courses are not required.*

These degrees are wonderful ways for high school students who studied at the college level to earn a university degree!
