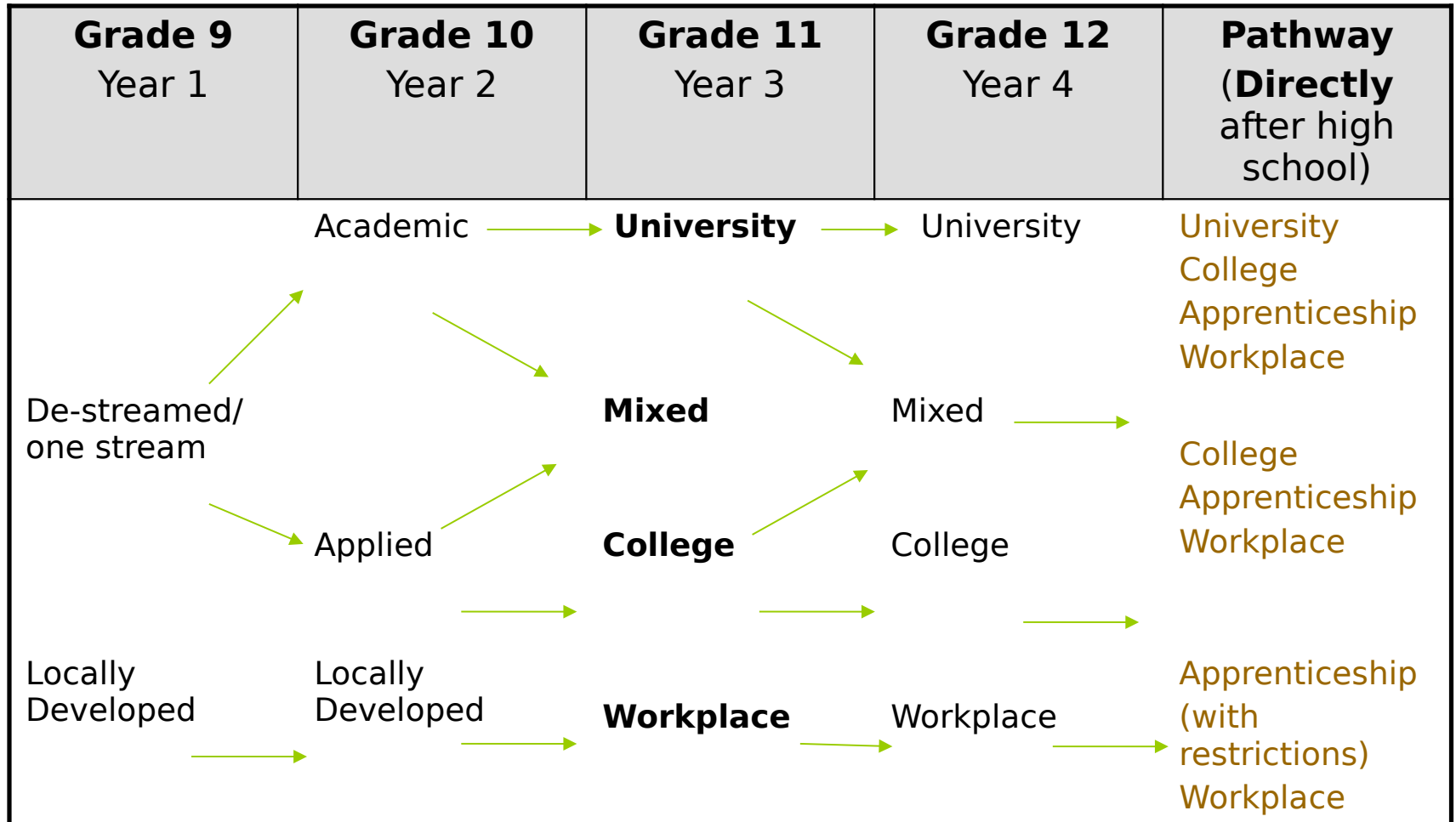

UNIVERSITY

- 3-4 year **degree** programs
- Various areas (or **faculties**) of study
- Potential for professional designations or further study (e.g. Masters, PhD)
- Common professions: teachers, lawyers, scientists, accountant, business analyst, nurses (RNs), engineers, architects, physiotherapist, computer programmer, etc.
- Predominantly theory/academic-based courses, however some also offer co-op

UNIVERSITY

Requirements (applying from high school):

- OSSD (High School Diploma)
- **A minimum of 6 grade 12 University/Mixed credits (4U/4M)**
- Grade 12 University English (**ENG4U**)
- Other requirements as specified by program/university

COLLEGE

- 2-3 year **diploma** programs:
Predominantly practical/hands-on courses
- Common professions: technicians, tradespeople, businesspeople, book keeper, nurses (RPNs), early childhood educator, veterinary assistant, dental hygienist, paramedic, graphic designer, etc.

General Requirements (from high school):


